INFORMATION ON THE PRIMO LANGUAGE TEST

The PRIMO language test examines specific language skills areas:

1. Understanding Words (Passive Vocabulary)

Objects, activities and characteristics are read to the student who is then asked to select the appropriate picture from a group of pictures. This is to be able to assess knowledge and understanding of words. A word can only be used correctly when its meaning has been comprehended; hence understanding words is the prerequisite to using them (active vocabulary). There is a strong link between the active and passive vocabularies.

2. Understanding Word Meanings (Abstract Terms)

Spatial relations(e.g., in front of/behind) as well as chronological processes (e.g., before/after) and comparative adjectives (e.g., bigger/smaller) are tested together with the child's understanding of colours and shapes. Responses are given by selecting the appropriate picture.

3. Phoneme Discrimination Test (Phonological Awareness)

Each test task consists of two words that either sound similar (e.g., Nadel -Nudel) or are the same (e.g., Dach - Dach). The point of the exercise is for the student to make the correct distinction (same/not the same). The phoneme discretion ability is considered an important requirement to learning reading and writing at a later time in the pupil's life.

4. The memorizing and understanding of texts (textual understanding)

Four short stories are given with five questions each, to see what has been understood. The result indicates how well the child is focused and if everything is understood.
